1. Introduction

The historic environment is protected at a national level within National Planning Policy Frameworkⁱⁱ (NPPF) chapter 16, and locally within Cornwall Local Planⁱⁱⁱ Policies 2, 14, 17, 23, 24, 25, the explanatory text for Policy 24 providing detailed information relating to the consideration of Heritage Assets within the planning process.

This document forms part of the Evidence Base for the Perranzabuloe NDP providing support for heritage policies within the NDP and should be referred to for further detail and guidance in the preparation of development proposals and the appraisal or assessment of them to ensure key features of value are protected and enhanced. Assets included are considered to be of a particular quality, value at a local or wider level, or contain features of noted value, to a degree which merits their specific protection within the Plan, in addition to existing adopted policies. Absence from the list does not preclude an asset from protection within development proposals.

Heritage assets, taken to be A building, monument, site, place, area or landscape identified as having a degree of significance meriting consideration in planning decisions, because of its heritage interest, were identified through a desk based exercise in line with guidance provided by Heritage England and Cornwall Council referring to publicly available registers and databases, a summary of these assets is provided within the report with links to records were available to avoid repetition. Covid-19 restrictions limited the extent of fieldwork and community engagement, a list of local heritage assets identified in the initial NDP Consultation process has also been included, further fieldwork including community led walkabout surveys may be required to understand the value and condition of none designated heritage assets and historic environments.

This record is intended to be used both to inform the design and appraisal of development proposals and to evaluate them during consultation and determination. NB: reference to this document is NOT intended to replace the requirement for detailed heritage assessment of a site's heritage assets and contribution to the wider historic environment of the area and likely effects of a proposed development on that baseline resource by an appropriately qualified and experience professional in line with the guidance provided by Heritage England. 

Figures are included as supplementary information throughout the document where it is felt they assist interpretation of an asset's location and / or extents. Cornwall Council's interactive mapping^{vi} provides an invaluable resource which should be referred to for precise locations and links to further information on the features of value for all levels of asset.

2. Existing recorded Heritage Assets within the Parish

Cornwall and West Devon Mining Landscapes World Heritage Site Area A7 St Agnes Mining District




Figure 1: WHS Area 7 coverage within the Plan Area

Location and Extents:

Northern end of designated area continues from St Agnes Parish along the coastal strip to the south west of the NDP area, from Hanover Cove to Droskyn Point at the southern end of Perran Bay.

Citation on <u>UNESCO World Heritage List</u> and on the <u>Heritage England</u> database. Online information at www.cornwall.gov.uk and www.cornishmining.org.uk including Management Plan detailing OUV and WHS planning advice.

Related designations:

Cligga Head SSSI, RAF Perranporth Scheduled Monument, multiple entries in Cornwall Sites and Monuments Record.

Key features of value:

 Iconic clifftop engine houses, tin works in narrow stream valleys and settlement pattern of granite mine workers cottages amongst fine public buildings and miners smallholdings



field patterns.

- Character within NDP area includes coastal influence, views along coast (notes those west from vantage points between Cligga Head and Droskyn), C18-C19 tin and copper mining and ancillary industries, impact of industrialisation,
- Walks taking in the exposed cliff workings and mineralogy along the 'stark' coastline of Cligga Head noted as a highlight.

Existing policy protection:

The WHS is an international level designation made and managed by UNESCO, as such the land within its boundary is protected at the highest policy levels. Within NPPF this includes paragraphs 184, 194, 200, 201, and 205. Within Cornall Local Plan the WHS is mentioned as a specific asset in Policies 14 Renewable Energy (in relation to the potential impacts of proposals on both the asset and its setting), and Policy 24 Historic Environment.

The WHS extends beyond Perranzabuloe's southern boundary into St Agnes Parish and is covered in the St Agnes NDP^{vii} Policy 11. Proposals which affect land within either the WHS or its setting will be required to consider the provisions of both the Perranzabuloe and St Agnes NDPs to ensure they address issues at a local level.



Scheduled Monuments




Figure 2: Scheduled Monuments within the Parish

Location and Extents:

There are Scheduled Monuments throughout Perranzabuloe as shown in Figure 2, the majority relate to the prehistoric or early medieval period with the exception of the remains within Trevellas



Airfield which straddles the Parish's southern boundary. Table 1 in Appendix 1 lists all Scheduled Monuments as extracted from Cornwall Council Interactive Mapping, these are summarised below.

When considered as a whole asset the SMs within the Parish present a picture of its value as a historic landscape which far precedes the more widely understood or immediately recognisable heritage relating to its mining history, and which relates to the wider prehistoric landscape beyond its boundaries including sites such as St Agnes Beacon and Kelsey Head.

Related designations:

WHS, St Piran's Oratory Grade II Listing, St Piran's Church Listing multiple entries in Cornwall Sites and Monuments Record.

Key features of value:

- Penhale Point Cliff Castle: Iron Age, incorporated into and to an extent protected by Wheal Golden post medieval mine workings and spoil heaps. Defended enclosure of 1ha, double line of landward defences with rock cut ditches across the neck of the promontory, excavations provided evidence of occupation around 100BC AD90.
- Ligger Point Bowl Barrows: Three Bronze Age Bowl Barrows aligned north west south east overlooking Perran Bay. Partially excavated in 1950s, urns found in all three barrows, two held by Royal Cornwall Museum in Truro, third retained within private collection. Enable an understanding of funerary practices and cultural associations within specific areas within the landscape.
- St Piran's Oratory and Cemetery: One of Perranzabuloe's most well known heritage sites, early Christian chapel within Gear Sands 1.5km inland established in C7 by St Piran following his arrival at Perranporth from Ireland and remaining in use until C11 or C12. Several skeletons and cist burials recorded during early C19 partial excavation and 1980 works which preceded the protective construction of an artificial sand dune over the remains. Became a pilgrim shrine in C15 as St Piran believed to have been buried in its cemetery. Construction, layout and scale shows similarities to Irish early Christian oratories and as such is also of value in wider understanding of the development of the faith. Also Grade II listed.
- St Piran's Church and St Piran's Cross: Lying around 300m east of the Oratory this scheduling covers the remains of the second St Piran's Church in Perranzabuloe, the adjacent 2.4m high carved granite Celtic Cross and the enclosure, or lann, around them which was occupied by the church community and used as a burial ground. The Church is a typical C12-C13 cruciform style building roughly at the centre of the lann, the site being recorded as a Celtic monastery called Lanpiran in the Domesday Book though it was later reduced in status to the Parish Church. Its preservation without amendments over the following centuries is due to its location and issues with encroaching sand recorded from



1281 onwards, in 1804 it was largely dismantled and used to construct the current Grade II* Listed Parish Church in Perranzabuloe 4.4km to the south.

- Higher Hendra Barrows: Twelve Bronze Age Bowl Barrows in a 250m north west south east linear alignment along the ridge of a north facing spur of land with six still visible above ground the highest being 2.2m, the remainder are relatively low with four flanking another single barrow. Aerial photography indicates further barrows are yet to be confirmed. The site is of value for its buried archaeology and information that will provide on the cemetery and the landscape contemporary to it, as well as a prominent and large feature within the wider prehistoric Perranzabuloe landscape.
- St Piran's Round: a late prehistoric round, comparatively small alongside Penhale Cliff Castle 4.9km to the north or Caer Dane 2.2km to the south with just one defensive enclosure which survives as a 3m high rampart the top of which was flattened to create a 2.5m wide walkway in the early medieval period when the site was adapted for use as a Plain an Gwarry or 'playing place' amphitheatre style site for the performance of medieval mystery and miracle plays. The Round is a useful example of the adaptation of then historic sites throughout history as well as for its buried archaeology relating to its original occupation.
- Rosehill Farm Barrows: three barrows, two remaining above ground, in an east west alignment on a ridge north of Goonhavern. Of value despite ploughing damage for site and landscape archaeology.
- Higher Reen Barrow: positioned on the northern end of a south facing spur of land and originally one of a pair the other having been ploughed out.
- Treworthal Barrow: positioned at the end of a north facing spur with land rising behind, approx. 625m south of Rosehill Farm Barrows, 1.6km south east of Higher Reen Barrow, and 935m north of Caer Kief. Suffered damage as a result of ploughing but still considered likely to hold site archaeology and is part of a wider prehistoric landscape.
- Little Carnkief Cross: medieval cross 1.01m high inscribed with 'Nansmellyn' referring to the adjacent manor of the same period, likely to be a boundary marker and in its original location, considered likely to have remains of the historic land surface and human activity below ground around it.
- Caer Kief Round: late prehistoric 1.4ha round with single rampart and ditch and single entrance located just below the summit of a south west facing spur of land between two tributaries of the Perranporth stream and across the valley from Caer Dane. Potential



continued use beyond prehistoric through an unfinished annexe, of most value for its condition, site archaeology and role in interpreting the wider local historic landscape.

- Caer Dane Hillfort: large late prehistoric multi enclosure fort on the summit of a hill surrounded by stream valleys and opposite Caer Kief. Its three defensive enclosures remain intact and above ground surrounding a well defined nucleus. The site's value lies in its own archaeology as well as its key role in the local prehistoric landscape, particularly the relationship with Caer Kief as well as the surrounding barrow sites.
- Polvenna Barrow: Bronze Age Bowl Barrow remaining as a low partially ploughed out mound in a prominent position on a north west facing spur between two streams.
- Tresawsen Hillfort: 3.8ha late prehistoric multi enclosure fort with two concentric defensive earthworks in relatively good condition which enables its interpretation in the landscape.
- Callestick Vean Barrow: Bowl Barrow unusually on relatively low lying land as the head of a tributary of the River Kenwyn, in relatively good condition. Of value for its low lying position.
- Higher Callestick: a single barrow 425m south west of Higher Callestick Farm on the eastern edge of a south facing spur between two streams with damage to one side and erosion at the base of the mound revealing the white quartzite or Spar stones which originally covered such structures to increase their prominence in the landscape, and two Bronze Age barrows 275m north of the farm which have been plough damaged located on the southern end of a spur between two streams. Both sites of value mostly for their landscape archaeology and construction.
- o Callestock Veor Round and Hut Circles: located on a south western slopes on the shoulder of a ridge above Perranzabuloe the late prehistoric Romano British Round appears to have been enclosed with timber palisade on the inner bank. Bronze Age Roman hut circles are evident on aerial photography and geophysical survey results, and enclosures around them represent farmers' dwellings and are thought to be connected to further hut circles and enclosures outside the round. Of value for its condition and likely below ground remains which enable understanding of the site's construction and use, as well as its contribution to interpretation of the local and wider prehistoric landscape through its connection to nearby sites.
- Pendown Bell Barrow: a nationally rare form of Bronze Age funerary monument which often contain rich grave goods and are thus associated with aristocratic individuals, with



their style of construction incorporating a berm and ditch around the central mounds making them particularly visually impressive. Pendown is located on a north west facing spur of land overlooked by the group at Four Burrows some 900m to the south east.

- Four Burrows: a group of four Bronze age bowl barrows straddling the Perranzabuloe Kenwyn Parish boundary and the A30, on a hilltop. The site has been excavated historically with one barrow found to house a megalithic chamber with cremation urn, the site is suggested to be the surviving core of a nucleated barrow cemetery and is noted as of value for the potential information about the site as well as the landscape in which it was built.
- Three Burrows: a large Bronze age bowl barrow with noted ploughing and antiquarian excavation damage but still standing at 3m high just 100m south of St Peter's Church and 400m west of three more (none scheduled) barrows with value in terms of landscape archaeology and the relationship between reuse of important sites across different time periods.
- Relationship between assets of a similar, or related period, in terms of present day intervisibility and interpretation in understanding the area's use and perception by communities contemporary to the assets at a landscape level.

Existing policy protection:

Scheduled Monuments derive their protection from the Ancient Monuments and Archaeological Areas Act of 1979, scheduling as a mechanism for protection having begun in 1882 and being carried out by Heritage England to preserve a selection of nationally important archaeological sites. Monuments are selected on the basis of period, rarity, documentation and finds, group value,

survival and condition, fragility and vulnerability, diversity, and potential, in all cases scheduling has to be considered to be the best means of protecting them.

Within the NPPF Scheduled Monuments are included in paragraphs 194 and 205. The Cornwall Local Plan covers their protection and management within the planning process in Policy 24.

Listed Structures

Location and Extents:

Listed structures are distributed across the Parish, tending to be located within or adjacent to settlements or long standing transport routes. Table 2 in Appendix 1 lists all Scheduled Monuments as extracted from Cornwall Council Interactive Mapping. There are no Grade I assets, 71 Grade II listed, 1 Grade II Listed Registered Park and Garden at Chyverton (see below), and 4 Grade II* listed



features. In several instances a number of listing relate to the same geographical site as the focus of the protection being architectural or structural tends to lead to separate designation of specific features. Examples include assets within the former Chyverton Estate which incorporates the main house, stables, lodge, farmhouse, park and gardens and a bridge, or the Parish Church of St Piran at Perranzabuloe and a number of the features within its graveyard.

Citations & Information:

For ease a table of listed structures is appended to this document, it was extracted from the information available through Cornwall Council's interactive mapping which should be referred to for individual location of assets, relationship to other features and links to citations.

Related designations:

Three of the assets relate to features also covered by Scheduled Monument status – St Piran's Church, the Cross adjacent to St Piran's Church, and St Piran's Oratory, several others have an overlap with Cornwall SMR records.

Key features of value:

<u>Heritage England</u>viii explains the purpose of Listing to be on the basis of a features' architectural or historic merit and in order to bring it within the protection of the planning system, it expands

'The general principles are that all buildings built before 1700 which survive in anything like their original condition are likely to be listed, as are most buildings built between 1700 and 1850.

Particularly careful selection is required for buildings from the period after 1945. Buildings less than 30 years old are not normally considered to be of special architectural or historic interest because they have yet to stand the test of time.'

It also notes that Listing does not prevent development, it provides a mean by which the effects of development on the feature of value can be controlled in the form of Listed Building consent, and states that features should be enjoyed and accessible where possible.

In many cases the geographical grouping of listed assets adds value in that it enables a preservation of their setting and enables a greater understanding or awareness of that site or area's historic development for example the listing of the Parish Church, its Vicarage and several features around the graveyard, the various features within the former Chyverton Estate, or the listing of several properties within Callestick which combine to add value overall as they contribute to the village's traditional character and protection with Conservation Area status.



Existing policy protection:

Listed Structures are included on the basis of nomination and approval by the Secretary of State for Digital, Culture, Media and Sport (DCMS) under section 1 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990. Features are selected on the basis of their compliance with a set of principles which notes 'For the purposes of listing, a 'building' includes any structure or erection and a 'listed building' includes any object or structure: (a) fixed to it; or (b) within its curtilage which, although not fixed to it, forms part of the land and has done so since before 1st July 1948, unless the list entry expressly excludes such things.' Principles include architectural interest, historic interest, group value, fixtures and features (in the case of buildings), character and appearance (in the case of Conservation Areas), age and rarity, national interest, aesthetic merits and selectivity.

Within the NPPF listed structures are included in paragraphs 184, and 194. The Cornwall Local Plan covers their protection and management within the planning process in Policy 24.

Registered Park and Gardens – Chyverton House

Location and Extents:

Chyverton House RPG, (Table 3 in Appendix 1) essentially the gardens and parkland associated with the former Chyverton Estate sits adjacent to the Parish's eastern boundary, within its own small valley between Zelah, Polgoda and Ventongimps with the plantations across its northern areas visible from the northern end of the Callestick Valley. The gardens are positioned to the north east of the house (screened from West Chiverton Mine by the house itself) leading down to a pond with weir and bridges, the parkland encircles the house which sits to its south western extents, much of the former parkland is now covered in woodland in varying condition.

Related designations:

Chyverton House Grade II*, Stables, Farm House, Lodge and a bridge (all Grade II listed), SMR Iron Age <u>Chiverton Round</u>, <u>Bronze Age Menhir</u> in field adjacent to south, <u>Medieval settlement</u> dated to 1291, the relocated <u>St Piran's Holy Well</u> at the western end of the pond, <u>Chiverton Mine</u> to north east of house, <u>East Chiverton Mine</u> on the northern boundary, <u>gardens</u>, and use of the House as a modern <u>Military Camp</u>.

Key features of value:

The Heritage England listing information provides the following chronology summary for Chyverton which set the garden as a primarily late C18 example, of a similar or slightly earlier period to the

main development of Tehidy (based on the date of the main cascade), <u>Trelowarren</u>, <u>Enys</u>, <u>Carclew</u>, <u>Trewithen</u>, <u>Heligan</u>, and several other estates associated with Cornwall's eldest landed families, with early C20 planting.

In the medieval period Chyverton was the property of the Arundell family, and subsequently passed to a tenant, John Rosogan. In 1724 it was purchased by John Andrew of Trevallance. Chyverton was inherited by his great-grandson, John Thomas, a lawyer from Truro who served as Vice-Warden of the Stanneries for thirty-four years. In the 1760s Thomas remodelled the existing house, and moved his business activities from Truro to Chyverton (Pett 1998). Some ten years later a park and an eyecatcher folly were created to complement the remodelled house. Gilbert (1820) noted that despite unpromising surroundings, 'by industry and expense, Chyverton displays many beauties, consisting of neat sheets of water, fine gardens, and thriving plantations'. In the early C19 the property passed by marriage to the Peter family. John Thomas Henry Peter (1810-73) married the daughter of John P Magor of Penventon, who in 1849 inherited Lamellan, Cornwall (qv). Chyverton remained in the Peter family until 1924 when it was sold to Treve Holman, who planted an extensive collection of rhododendrons and magnolias with the advice of Sir Harold Hillier (1905-85). After the Second World War Holman concentrated on extending his collection of magnolias, work continued by his son and daughter-in-law who succeeded to the property in 1959. Today (2000) Chyverton remains in divided private ownership.

It also notes the following main features of interest in terms of garden or designed / made landscape features within or relating to the designated area:

- Course of predating surrounding roads altered to enable enclosure of the estate (1770 survey);
- Views north-east from the house towards Tinkers Castle or Hunter's Tower, now obscured by vegetation;
- Main drive enters from south east by C19 lodge, sweeps north and west through the park and Merton Plantation before dividing with one branch running north to the kitchen garden and service entrance and the other continuing across the lake to approach the house from the south east.
- Walled kitchen garden to north of house (functional not aesthetic design feature along with late C18 stables);



Lake to north of house with Grade II* 1780 Bridge;

 \circ Late C18 Tinker's Castle (renamed Hunters Tower) folly / eyecather to north of the house at

Cost - is - Lost.

Late C18 design having open paddocks and meadows at heart of estate, developed as a

Pinetum in 1840s.

o Informal ornamental tree and shrub planting across slopes rising to north of house behind

lake begun around 1870, extended in 1920s with advice from sir Harold Hillier.

Pleasure grounds post 1945 collection of Magnolias.

Further detailed information is held within the Kresen Kernow archives and is a recommended

source for the development of any restorative projects for the site.

Existing policy protection:

Inclusion on the Heritage England List protects Chyverton Park on the same basis as other listed

assets under section 1 of the Planning (Listed Buildings and Conservation Areas) Act 1990.

Within the NPPF listed structures are included in paragraphs 184, and 194. The Cornwall Local Plan

covers their protection and management within the planning process in Policy 24.

Conservation Areas

Location and Extents:

Two Conservation Areas lie within the Parish, one at Callestick and the eastern section of the

Mithian Conservation Area(the parish boundary running along the Perranporth Stream through the

village) around the Rose in Vale County Hotel, these are listed in Table 3 in Appendix 1.

Citations & Information:

There is no Conservation Area Appraisal available for either area, presenting a potential NDP project.

Conservation Area Appraisals are designed to record the key features of value within an area,

including buildings, structures, planting, layout, as well as overall character. They are a useful tool in

preparing and determining development proposals. On the basis of fieldwork it is presumed that

both villages are designated by virtue of the concentration of older properties focused around a

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tight core at the junction of key routes through them.

Callestick

Perranzabuloe NDP: Heritage Assets

Existing recorded Heritage Assets within the Parish



First recorded as a settlement in 1201 with reference to a medieval chapel to its west around Mithian Farm (exact location unknown), Mithian's overall character features a few cob and thatch cottages but has a stronger tie to mining with rows of cottages and the presumed late C18 Miner's Arms pub at the village centre. The section within Perranzabuloe is defined by the wooded valley surrounding the grounds of the Rose in Vale which doesn't differ greatly from the OS 1880 mapping. Related designations:

Key features of value:

Within each village are several listed structures and records on the local SMR, several citations for individual historic features note the requirement for further investigation to determine exact details.

- Grade II C17 / C18 Elmsleigh and Jasmin Cottages, mid C18 Callestick Farm Cottage, late C18 Old Post Office, late C18 The Homestead, early C19 bridge, early C19
 Callestick Farmhouse, and early C20 phone box.
- o Modern cast iron fingerpost.
- Early medieval <u>Bethaw Chapel</u> at central junction by Callestick Farmhouse claimed to have been used by St Piran for preaching.
- o Another <u>medieval chapel</u> in the grounds of Caradon.
- o C18 house / old post office used by John Wesley for early Methodist meetings.
- Early C19 <u>Smithy</u> to south east of village, now Denver Cottage.

Mithian

- Medieval <u>settlement</u> dated to 1201, recorded at junction of lanes outside Miner's Arms.
- Medieval <u>chapel</u> to north west of Mithian Farm.
- Grade II Miner's Arms pub, presumed from a date in plasterwork to date to around 1780.
- Grade II Mithian Manor House (now converted to residential dwellings) dating to
 C17 with tunnel to Miner's Arms, original plaster ceiling and oak staircase remaining.



- Early <u>Grade II C18 bridge</u> over Perranporth Stream (within Perranzabuloe) immediately west of road junction.
- Early C18 <u>corn Mill and leats</u> to the north of the Rose in Vale grounds on the Perranporth stream.
- o C18 Grade II Old Post Office and Whitewalls Cottage, Tuckaway Thatch cottage,
- C18 Grade II* Rose in Vale former country house now hotel.
- Modern period <u>cast iron fingerpost</u> at village centre.

Existing policy protection:

Relevant references in NPPF include paragraph 186, footnote 62, para 200 and para 201. Within the Cornwall Local Plan Conservation Areas are protected within Policy 24 in order to maintain their special character and appearance.

Cornwall Sites and Monuments Record

Location and Extents:

The 583 SMR records are scattered across the Parish and listed in Table 4 in Appendix 1. Mines and Engine Houses are summarised separately in Table 5 and Table 6 respectively). They range from specific structures, features or single buildings to field systems, hillforts and early settlements.

Citations & Information:

Links to citations are contained within Table 4 as well as the Cornwall Council online mapping and should be referred to for specific details.

Related designations:

Many of the records relate to features also protected within higher level designations – WHS, Scheduled Monuments, Listed Structures etc. The majority lie outside of other designations and as such are at a degree of risk, reliant on development proposals identifying and recording them as part of the design and construction process.

Key features of value:

Features of value are too numerous to describe individually, in fact the greatest value of the SMR is perhaps collective in its illustration of the development and occupation of the Parish from prehistoric to modern periods and the provision of more detail relating to specific larger sites.

Collation of this value and further research into specific features would be an appropriate NDP project.



Existing policy protection:

Records within the SMR are afforded a general level of protection with Cornwall Local Plan Policy 24, with additional protection if they fall within a higher level designation.



3. Relationship between Perranzabuloe Heritage Assets evidence base and Neighbourhood Development Plan (NDP)

Policy

Heritage is an intrinsically valued area, though it is often only the most visible or well preserved features which are noticed, the 'sense of place' or 'time depth' within an area is often referred to in one form or another when asking residents or visitors to describe what they consider of importance within it. It provides a connection to a landscape through the contemporary community's relationship with the remnants of previous occupation as studied in more depth in Philip Marsden's Cornwall based Rising Ground*. It is also an aspect which can be viewed negatively where it is seen to hinder or stifle new development required to retain a living landscape as part of sustainability. As such the policies within the NDP seek to preserve the past in a way which enables the future and where development enables this it will be supported.

The Heritage section of the NDP sets its Aim as to support opportunities to improve and enhance what is special about an asset through development and change, within the context of protection and not compromising the value of the asset or other policies in this Plan

As such, all the Policies within the section relate in some way to active heritage conservation and positive management, they are:

- o HAE1. Heritage Assets and the Historic Environment
- HAE2. Signs and Advertising
- o HAE3. Conservation Areas and none designated historic settlements
- HAE4. Historic landscape character
- HAE5. Cornwall and West Devon WHS Area A7 St Agnes Mining District
- o HAE6. St Piran's Church and St Piran's Oratory
- HAE7. Penhale Camp and assets within its boundaries and setting
- HAE8. Perranzabuloe's Prehistoric Assets and Landscape
- HAE9. Newly Identified Heritage Assets and Archaeological Remains



Preparation of Planning submissions

it is expected that all planning submissions for development within the Parish will have been prepared with reference to the NDP and its supporting Evidence Base documents of which the Heritage Assets summary is one. All final proposals should demonstrate the way in which they have been informed by, and respond to, any historic features or their setting in a manner that is appropriate to the nature and scale of the proposed development.

It is expected that for all proposals which qualify as Major Development, are within a designated area or its setting and are greater than 100m^2 floorspace, provide 10 or more residential dwellings (separately or as a whole), and which may be likely to have a substantial impact on the heritage value of features within the site or the setting of features relating to it, a Heritage Appraisal of a level of detail proportionate to the development will have been carried out by a suitably qualified professional, and that the findings of this will be incorporated in the final proposals in a manner which demonstrates that the historic value has been assessed and understood using best practice methods in line with NPPF para.172.

Reference should be made to Cornwall and West Devon Mining Landscape World Heritage Site SPD, and Cornwall Building Stone and Slate Guide, and when published the Distinctiveness Guide, and Cornwall Materials Guide. The Cornwall Design Guide and Perranzabuloe Design Guide for Main Settlements, also provide useful historic development and design styles information. Development outside the main settlement areas assessed within the Design Guide should demonstrate consideration of the historic character of the closest adjacent settlement – be that one of the three, or a village, hamlet or farmstead – in its layout and design.

In this way the heritage of the Parish should be used to positively direct sensitive and well-designed development which enhances the area overall.

Evaluation of Planning Applications

Policies relating to heritage assets will be referred to in the review of all planning submissions within the Parish to ensure that development is policy compliant and beneficial to the area. Consideration will also be given to the criteria of the and WHS and the requirements relating to Listed Building Consent and Conservation Area Approvals. Development within the WHS or the setting of other designated features will be supported where (subject to the tests of exceptional circumstances) it can be demonstrated that the development is in the public interest as set out in national policy,



proposals demonstrate how they are in accordance with the weight afforded to the WHS's landscape and site level significance in national policy, meet the aims and objectives of the WHS Management Plan and the NDP Policies and they have appropriate regard to the conservation and maintenance of the Parish's historic record on a site and landscape basis.

Future proposed development in Perranzabuloe NDP area will be assessed against heritage policy, and, once completed, the Local List. This summary document aims to provide a basis for identifying potential records within a site and its setting and the ability to research the value of these as part of an appropriate and proportionate Heritage Appraisal in order to demonstrate that any harm resulting from the proposals has been avoided or successfully mitigated.

Projects

A number of potential projects have been identified in the course of preparing the Heritage Assets summary which should be considered as a starting point for further community input and engagement including:

- Collaboration between the Local History Group, local community and Cornwall's Heritage team to collate and research a 'Local List' with accompanying photographic record as an interactive gazetteer, utilising the potential to run survey and recording projects as resources for local schools, colleges or related higher education courses, taking Tamblyn's Way as an example pilot project.
- Proactive and sensitive restoration of locally valued features such as Tamblyn's Way in Perranporth, Chacewater and Newquay Branch Railway, Penwartha Dame School, Bolingey Bone Mill etc., to enable contemporary use and enjoyment in a manner which does not result in harm to heritage value.
- Development of app based and physically waymarked trails that will enable increased enjoyment and understanding of the area's heritage based on period or area in a way which engages the permanent as well as tourist community.
- Working with landowners and farmers to increase awareness of heritage assets on their land and the appropriate management practices to ensure value is retained.

Appendix 2: Projects – Local List

The need for a Local List, recording all heritage assets valued by the community which are not otherwise protected by another mechanism, was identified in the consultation stage of the NDP process and an initial selection of assets collated. Covid 19 restrictions precluded the community led input which is requited for such a project, as such it is included within the NDP Projects list and until such a time as they are covered by any other Policy or deisngaiton (some may be suitable candidates for Listing) the assets on it are protected under HAE1. Heritage Assets and the Historic Environment, HAE3. Conservation Areas and none designated historic settlements, HAE4. Historic landscape character, and HAE9. Newly Identified Heritage Assets and Archaeological Remains.

		Tamblyn Way was a relatively flimsy and dangerous construction and was replaced by a more substantial structure in the mid 1800's and repairs carried out in the 1890's, funded by Perranporth Street Lighting Committee (which years later became Perranporth Gardens Charities),. In 1974 Tamblyn Way was rebuilt and named after a prominent resident and Parish Councillor.			
		The location of Tamblyn Way is relatively sheltered and the Parish Council is anxious not to lose one of the few remnants of social history left in the parish but any replacement would require highly engineered and costly designs due to the erosion of the cliffs but the replacement of Tamblyn Way has strong support from the public.
